This Show is conducted subject to the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, the constitution and rules of the Society and any regulation, which appears within the Schedule for individual sections of this Show. Should there be any conflict between the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Society, the constitution and rules of this society and the regulations appearing in any schedule, the constitution, rules and regulations appearing in the schedule of this Society shall prevail.

### ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES

1. The attention of intending exhibitors is drawn to the fact that entries are accepted subject to the rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies and to the Constitution and Rules of this Association in addition to any Special Regulations which appear within this Schedule.

### ENTRIES

2. Please refer to each section. All entry fees are GST inclusive

### NO LATE ENTRIES

3. Completed entry forms, where requested, together with fees should be in the hands of the Chief Steward or Secretary within one week of Show.

4. The Society reserves the right of refusing or cancelling any entry without giving reasons for doing so.

### PRIZE MONEY

5. All prizes are paid on the authority of the award entered in the Judge's Book. When such prizes are paid, to whomsoever they are paid, the Society's responsibilities cease, and no claim can afterwards be entered. All prize winners are requested to obtain prizes from the Secretary's Office on Show days. All prize money is GST inclusive and exhibitors are requested to complete the necessary declaration on their entry forms.

6. Where the prizes are stated as having been donated by a particular person or firm, they take the place of the Society's prizes, and are not in addition unless expressly stated. In the event of a tie, prize money will be divided. In awarding trophies, the committee may provide Prize Money and Trophy to the value of the stated trophy.

7. In classes where there is no competition. i.e. Only one Exhibitor, the Society reserves the right to award half prize money, if they should so wish.

### POINTS (where stipulated)

8. Points shall be allotted as follows: First prize 3 points; Second prize 2 points; Third prize 1 point Where only one entry, only 1 point for first. Where only two entries, 2 points for first, 1 point for second. First prize only awarded if less than 3 entries, unless specified by the Judge. This applies to all sections.

### EXHIBITS

9. Where display space is limited, preference will be given to prize-winning exhibits.

10. No exhibits may be removed without the consent of the Stewards, before 3.30pm Sunday unless otherwise stated.

11. Pavilion exhibits must remain in place until after 3.30pm Sunday. Gates will be open to the public at 8am Friday.

12. Exhibits entered in the wrong class by the Exhibitor may be transferred to the proper class by the Stewards.

## **JUDGING**

13. The Judge need not award any prize to an exhibit that in his/her opinion does not comply with the conditions.
14. In the judging of Livestock, all questions as to the eligibility of any exhibit with reference to age or breed shall be decided by the Judge. If necessary, judging the class may be deferred until the Exhibitor has produced proof.
15. The Judge may award Second Prize if the exhibit is not worthy of a first and shall not award any prize if the Exhibit is not considered to be of sufficient merit.

## **STEWARDS**

16. Stewards shall attend to the Reception, Classification, Numbering and placing of all exhibits and to all matters in connection therewith and are responsible for the return of all exhibits to owners.
17. The Judge is to be furnished with a Schedule of Prizes, but no information as to the name or place of the owner of the exhibits.
18. Stewards shall prepare Prize Cards and see that these and any Ribbons are properly fixed to the Prize Exhibits. Stewards are to request the Secretary for their requirements of cards, ribbons and stationery within one month of Show Days.

## **PROTESTS**

19. The Steward of each section shall settle any dispute arising therein, but the exhibitor has the privilege of lodging a written protest against any decision thus given, which will be dealt with by the Committee, whose ruling is final.
20. All Protests must be lodged with the Secretary in writing with a deposit of \$50 not later than half an hour after the award has been made. The deposit, in any protest considered frivolous, will be forfeited to the Society.

## **SOCIETY'S RESPONSIBILITIES**

21. All competitors compete at their own risk.
22. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may occur to any exhibit at the Show, and it shall be a condition of entry that each competitor shall hold the Association harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from the accident.
23. The Society will not under any consideration, hold itself responsible for any loss, damage or miss delivery of livestock or other exhibits at the Society's Show.
24. Any prize not claimed during the Show will be forfeited to the Society.
25. Exhibitors and persons admitted to the grounds shall be subject to the Rules, Regulations and Orders of the Stewards and are required to pay normal admission prices unless exempted by the Association.
26. The foregoing Rules and Regulations, Rules of the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies, and the Notes as set forth in the Schedule are the conditions of competition. Any matter arising not specially provided for in the foregoing shall be determined by the Committee, whose decisions shall be final.
27. Stall holders must ensure that ALL power leads and electrical appliances display a current tag indicating that each lead has been tested and approved by an authorized person in accordance with the requirements of the Workplace Health and Safety Act. i.e. has been tested after the 1/1/18
28. EXHIBITORS ARE ADVISED THAT NO ELECTRIC FENCES ARE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS DURING THE PERIOD OF THE SHOW AND THAT THE SHOW SOCIETIES WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY OFFICERS ARE AUTHORISED TO CUT AND REMOVE SAME WITHOUT NOTICE.

#### CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- (a) Entry is open to any person who wishes to enter.
- (b) Entries to be given to the Chief Steward either at QAH club meeting or via email to the address below.
- (c) Entry fee is \$2.00 for each nominated entry.
- (d) Entries close at 10pm Friday 24th May 2019, late entries may not be accepted due to space.
- (e) Entry fees should accompany the Entry Form. Cheques to be made payable to Queensland Hobbyists Incorporated.
- (f) Entry fees must be paid in full before entry is installed.
- (g) Entries may be installed from Saturday 1st June between 10.00am and 10.00pm, Sunday 2nd June between 2.00pm and 10.00pm, Monday 3rd June between 12.00pm and 10.00pm and Tuesday 4th June between 12.00pm and 10.00pm
- (h) Hands out of entries at 10.00pm Tuesday 4th June 2019
- (i) Judging will be Wednesday 5th June 2019
- (j) Equipment supplied includes – stands, lights, power supply and air supply.
- (k) Exhibitors to supply – their own heaters, a 1m (36”) lead/power board (S.E.C. approved) and their own aquariums, which must be either:
  - 1) 2 foot tanks - 600mm length x min 300mm to max 450mm width x 350 to 400mm height
  - 2) 3 foot tanks - 900mm length x min 380mm x up to 450mm width x 450mm height **(16 spaces only)**
  - 3) 4 foot tanks - 1220mm length x 450mm width x up to 450mm height **(4 spaces only)**

**\*\*If you wish to use either 3ft or 4ft tanks make sure you call ahead as there are limited numbers of spaces available and these will be handed out on a first come first served basis.**

Note: There are limited number of 2ft, 3ft and 4ft tanks available for competitors to use, these will be made available on a first come basis. All entries must fit into supplied tanks, this includes any filters used, no free-standing entries permitted.

- (l) Maximum of 2 competitive fish entries per tank. 3 competitive entries are permitted only when a combination of Fish entry plus any of, Community, Planted, Furnished and Novelty are entered.
- (m) Nominated fish **MUST** be measured by the stewards before installing in tank otherwise a maximum of 10 points will be awarded for size irrespective of the size of the fish.
- (n) Group1 classes will be judged using IBA Standards. All other classes will be judged in accordance with QFAS judging criteria.
- (o) Classes 31, Design and Technique classes will be judged at 50 points for Design and 50 points for Technique. Fish will not count towards overall score.
  - All plants, rocks, ornaments, filtration, gravel and fish will be provided.
- (p) Any class with less than 6 entries may be combined with a similar class.
- (q) Fish to be judged **MUST** be nominated by competitor. No best in tank accepted.
- (r) Animals (any fish, invertebrate, amphibian or reptile) other than those nominated for judging may be included to improve the quality of the display.
- (s) Where permits are required for display of a species then copies of the permits must be provided to the stewards before installation of entry. When rare/new species are entered for judging, it is up to the competitor to provide supporting documentation. Otherwise the entry will be judged at the Chief Stewards discretion.
- (t) If your entry requires live food then it must be fed before hands out 10.00pm Tuesday 4th June and should be fed no more than can be eaten overnight so that no live food remain in tank by time judging takes place. Also, there must be no live food in the tank during the time the show is open to the public.
- (u) All entries are eligible for Best Display.

- (v) Any sick fish will not be judged.
- (w) Steward's collective decision is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
- (x) A copy of rules and standards will be available upon request at all times.
- (y) Entries to be removed between 4.00pm and 10.00pm Sunday 9th June 2019 and if needed Monday 10th June between 10.00am and 6.00pm.
- (z) All care is taken with entries, but the Q.A.H accepts no responsibility for any loss or damages incurred.

**Please note:** Tank spaces available for this show will be limited to a maximum of 5 tank spaces for each competitor to start with. If all spaces have not been filled by Friday 24th May then competitors will be able to have as many extra spaces as they require until all spaces have been filled.

- 2) Standard Class (Male & Female) – Body minimum 3.2 cm SL excluding caudal (Tip of mouth to caudal peduncle).
- 3) Junior Giant – Body minimum 5cm SL excluding caudal (Tip of mouth to caudal peduncle).

4) Senior Giant – Body minimum 6.4 cm SL excluding caudal (Tip of mouth to caudal peduncle).

**Australian Bred Entries:** All entrants in these classes must be Australian residents. Bettas entered into these classes must be fish the exhibitor has personally spawned, raised and entered. No purchased or acquired fish will be eligible to be entered into this category.

**Individual Entries:** The entrant must have spawned, raised and entered the fish personally.

**Team Entries:** Team entries are the product of two people working closely together in different fishrooms to produce a line of bettas. Teams usually involve one person breeding the fish and then giving the young, unsexed juveniles to another person who will rear them in their fishrooms to showable size and training. Teams are not people who purchase or are gifted a fish from another breeder.

**Family Entries:** All family members share the same fishroom, which is located at one address. All duties are shared, and each member is equally involved in the breeding and raising of the fish. If two family members work from the same fishroom but maintain separate lines and all fishroom duties are carried out independently, then they must enter as individuals.
